

**EUCLID HIGH SCHOOL
LOCAL MONEY SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION
INSTRUCTIONS - 2011**

The local money scholarships are awarded through the Euclid Schools Foundation/Euclid Schools Alumni Association, and other local organizations. The scholarships will be awarded at the Senior Awards Program in May.

There are several types of scholarships available. They are grouped according to category. All scholarship awards are based on the student's academics, leadership characteristics, and participation in extracurricular and community activities. Specific qualifications are listed below each scholarship's description.

Please read these instructions carefully before filling out the application form.

1. Review the list of available scholarships (attached) and mark the top sheet of your application with those you would like to apply for and feel you are qualified to receive. (You may apply for more than one, but ***be sure you meet the qualifications for each.***)
2. Fill out the application form completely. Print or type **neatly**. You must enter information in each section. Incomplete or illegible applications will be disqualified.
3. You must request a transcript from your counselor to attach to your application. No attachments other than transcripts will be accepted, unless specified in the scholarship description.
4. Applications must be submitted on **or before Friday, April 29, 2011.**
5. Applications turned in after that date will not be accepted.

Criteria for Selection

All scholarship criteria include:

- a desire for further education, an expressed or concrete aim or direction of study, and traits such as honesty, responsibility, and dependability;
- the capability of advanced education, a high academic standing and satisfactory academic test scores; and
- leadership and/or involvement in extracurricular activities in school, religious, civic and social organizations.

Additional criteria are included with the individual scholarship description.

Applicants must have at least a B average, demonstrate high financial need, and have been accepted at Cleveland State University, Cuyahoga Community College or Lakeland Community College.)

Sports

Harold "Doc" Daugherty Male Basketball Scholarship (Applicant must have participated in the EHS male basketball program and demonstrated athletic ability.)

Ray Fisher Male Baseball Scholarship (Applicant must have participated in the EHS baseball program and demonstrated athletic ability and academic achievement.)

Paul Serra Baseball Scholarship (Applicant must have participated in the EHS baseball program and demonstrated athletic ability.)

Sports Hall of Fame Student and/or Athlete Scholarship (Applicant should have participated one or more sports. Award is also based on financial need.)

Music - Instrumental

Bruce Carlson Memorial Scholarship (Applicant must be actively enrolled playing a musical instrument as a performing musician/member of the Euclid High School Band and/or Orchestra, but need not be planning to major in music.)

Dale Harper Music Scholarship (Applicant must be a female who participated in the EHS band and/or orchestra. The scholarship is open to all instrumental music students; however, applicants planning to pursue a degree or career in music education are preferred.)

Albert Sheppert Memorial Scholarship (Applicant must be a male student who is and has been an active member of the EHS band or orchestra. The scholarship is open to all instrumental music students; however, applicants planning to pursue a degree or career in music education are preferred.)

Music - Vocal

Bea Grushcow Memorial Scholarship (Applicant must have participated in the EHS choral program.

The scholarship is open to all choral students; however, applicants planning to pursue a degree in music education and who have been involved in high school music programs are preferred.)

Sam Taylor Memorial Scholarship (Applicant must have participated in the EHS choral program. The scholarship is open to all choral students; however, applicants planning to pursue a degree or career in music are preferred.)

Education

Euclid Teachers Association Education Scholarship (Applicant must be planning to major in any education field (Early Education, Elementary Education, or Secondary Education—specific fields of study are also acceptable) and have at least a 3.0 accumulated GPA. Applicant must attach *two letters of recommendation* in addition to transcripts.)

Jane Barber Gibson Education Scholarship (Award is also based on a test scores, tentative desire to enter the field of education, honesty, responsibility and dependability.)

Earl Oliverio Scholarship (Applicant must be a female who is planning to enter the field of education. Applicant must have passed all parts of the Ohio Graduation Test.)

Scientific Research/Medical

Freed Family Scholarship (Applicant must be planning to pursue a career in scientific research at the university level; plan to go to college, and then do graduate work with the goal of getting either an M.D. or Ph.D. degree.)

Jane Barber Gibson Nursing Scholarship (Award is also based on test scores, tentative desire to enter field of nursing, honesty, responsibility and dependability.)

Vocational/Technical School

Jaycees Technical Scholarship (Award based on the student's financial need, the student's essay, and plan to attend a vocational/technical school.)

Mike Raicevich Scholarship – Vocational (One male and one female scholarship available for students who plan on a post-high school vocational program of study. Selected students will have a GPA of 2.0 or better, demonstrate high financial need, and have been selected at a vocational training program or school.)
